What is The Well?

The Well is a ministry dedicated to high school students. Each Tuesday night we have a time of incredible worship, Biblical teaching, and small groups. The Well happens on Tuesday nights from 630-830pm in the youth room.

What other programs are offered for high school students?

In addition to our Tuesday night programming we also offer Grounded, a Bible study for high school students each Sunday during the 9am service in the youth room. This is a time to dig deeper into the Bible and learn more about Jesus.

What do you offer for high school students as far as camps and trips?

We have three annual events: Winter Weekend (February), Summer Camp (June or July), and a Mission Trip (Fall Break).

Why does The Well meet on Tuesday nights?

This is a time separate from any other programming at EHCC and we feel this is a special night dedicated to high school students.
